- Dr. Sagar Galwankar Scientific Chairman of OMAG addressed the august gathering in person and emphasized the role of trans-organization approach to developing health security and emergency health across India
- Convened by WHO-CCET Director Professor Dr. Sanjiv Bhoi the meeting was presided over by Executive Director and CEO of AIIMS Bhopal Dr. Ajai Singh

- Importance was placed on various aspects of response planning namely:
 - I. Mass Education of Medical Students and Qualified Specialists for responding to emergencies
 - II. Response planning for Public Health Emergencies
 - III. Lessons Learnt from COVID19
 - IV. Education Standards and Uniformity in Training
 - V. Continuous and sustainable models for life support training of mass population

- Presentations were done by successful initiatives across India including New Delhi, Tamil Nadu and Kerala.

- Educational Models are facing huge gaps and disparities with non-uniform training programs and staff who are not in sync with current standards of emergency medicine across world.

- The meeting brought to light the importance of partnering across specialties to develop a uniform trans specialty governmental and public health response network in BHARAT.

- Private Health Care Nursing Homes and small hospitals play a major role in response planning and working with various specialty organizations is crucial to build a civilian based response network in emergencies.

The Meeting ended with citing the need for organizations to work together and focus on cooperation and collaboration to secure the health of the nation.
